- (3) To establish procedures for licensing apprentices;
- (4) To keep a list of all individuals currently licensed by the Board;
- (5) To investigate any alleged violation of this title; [and]
  - (6) To enforce this title; AND
- (7) TO ADOPT RULES AND REGULATIONS REGARDING FALSE AND MISLEADING ADVERTISING AND MISREPRESENTATION.

- ((a) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, to qualify for a mortician license, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the requirements of this section.
  - (b) The applicant shall be of good moral character.
  - (c) The applicant shall be at least 18 years old.
- (d) (1) The applicant shall have completed successfully the apprenticeship requirements of this subtitle.
  - (2) An apprenticeship shall include:
- (i) 2 years of practical experience in this State and a 1-year course of study at a college of embalming that is approved by the Board or by the Conference of Funeral Service Examining Boards of the United States; or
- (ii) 1 year of practical experience in this State and a 2-year course of study at a college of embalming that is approved by the Board or by the Conference of Funeral Service Examining Boards of the United States.
- (3) The practical experience of an apprentice shall include:
  - (i) Participation in at least 20 funerals; and
- $% \left( 11\right) =0$  (ii) Assistance in the embalming of at least 20 dead human bodies.
- (e) Except as otherwise provided in this title, the applicant shall pass an examination given by the Board under this subtitle.]
- (A) THE BOARD SHALL DETERMINE THE QUALIFICATIONS NECESSARY FOR A PERSON TO LAWFULLY ENGAGE IN THE PRACTICE OF MORTUARY
