

(3) THE BOARD SHALL NOTIFY THE APPLICANT OF ELIGIBILITY FOR EXAMINATION AT LEAST 15 DAYS BEFORE THE EXAMINATION.

(4) ANY APPLICANT WHO FAILS TO APPEAR FOR A SCHEDULED EXAMINATION AND STILL DESIRES TO TAKE THE EXAMINATION SHALL FILE A NEW APPLICATION AND PAY A NEW FEE. THE BOARD MAY WAIVE THIS REQUIREMENT FOR GOOD CAUSE.

(D) (1) THE BOARD SHALL HOLD LICENSE EXAMINATIONS ON THE 4TH FRIDAY OF EVERY MONTH AT 12 NOON IN THE BOARD'S OFFICE.

(2) THE LICENSE EXAMINATION SHALL REQUIRE KNOWLEDGE OF ALL APPLICABLE CODES OR OTHER RULES, LAWS, OR PRINCIPLES OF ELECTRICAL INSTALLATIONS.

(3) THE QUESTIONS SHALL BE OBTAINED FROM A LIST OF QUESTIONS SUBMITTED BY THE UNIFORM ELECTRICAL LICENSING EXAMINATION COMMITTEE.

(E) (1) APPLICANTS SHALL FILE THEIR APPLICATIONS WITH THE BOARD AT LEAST 45 DAYS BEFORE THE EXAMINATION DATE.

(2) EACH APPLICANT SHALL TAKE AND PASS THE OBJECTIVE WRITTEN EXAMINATION TO DETERMINE THEIR FITNESS FOR A MASTER ELECTRICIAN'S LICENSE.

(3) THE PASSING GRADE FOR THE EXAMINATION SHALL BE 70 PERCENT AND THE NOTICE FOR THE EXAMINATION SHALL SPECIFY THE PASSING GRADE.

(F) (1) WITHIN 45 DAYS AFTER THE EXAMINATION, THE BOARD SHALL INFORM THE APPLICANT, IN WRITING, WHETHER OR NOT THE APPLICANT PASSED THE APPLICATION.

(2) IF THE APPLICANT PASSED, THE BOARD SHALL ISSUE A LICENSE, SUBJECT TO COMPLIANCE BY THE APPLICANT WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (J) OF THIS SECTION.

(3) THE LICENSE SHALL BE ISSUED ONLY IN THE PERSONAL NAME OF THE LICENSEE OR TO A LICENSEE AS A QUALIFIED AGENT ASSIGNED TO A SINGLE PERSON, FIRM, OR CORPORATION BY WHICH THE LICENSEE IS PRINCIPALLY EMPLOYED.

(G) (1) IF THE BOARD REJECTS AN APPLICANT'S APPLICATION FOR A MASTER ELECTRICIAN'S LICENSE, THE APPLICANT MAY APPEAL TO A BOARD OF ARBITRATION.

(2) THE BOARD OF ARBITRATION SHALL CONSIST OF 3 PERSONS: ONE PERSON SELECTED BY THE APPLICANT; ONE PERSON SELECTED BY THE BOARD; AND A THIRD PERSON SELECTED BY THE 2 PERSONS NAMED TO THE BOARD OF ARBITRATION BY THE APPLICANT AND BOARD, RESPECTIVELY.
