(2) The annual license fee for restaurants serving alcoholic beverages on Sunday under this subsection is \$100 in addition to the annual license fee for the license held.

DRAFTER'S NOTE: This repeals provisions of law that failed referendum of the voters of Garrett County at the general election held in November 1984.

The provisions of law were contained in Ch. 129 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1984, which further provided, in Section 2. of that Act, that if a majority of the votes cast in the election were "For allowing restaurants in Garrett County to serve alcoholic beverages on Sunday between the hours of 1 p.m. and midnight" the provisions of the act shall become effective on the 30th day following the official canvass of votes for the referendum.

The failure of the referendum was noted by the Michie Company.

(a-1) In Cecil County, the Board of County Commissioners shall appoint three other persons, all of whom are to be of high moral character and possess a sound reputation for integrity, to constitute the board of license commissioners for the county. The members of the board shall designate their own chairman. The first members of the board shall be appointed for three-, four-and five- year terms, respectively, and their successors for terms of five years each. The board of license commissioners shall meet at least once a month. The annual salary of the chairman is \$1,500 and the annual salary of the other commissioners is \$1,200. Each shall receive necessary expenses in connection with his duties to be paid by the [Commissioner] COMMISSIONERS.

DRAFTER'S NOTE: This corrects a typographic error in Article 2B, § 150(a-1).

The error occurred in Ch. 368 of the Acts of the Regular Session of the General Assembly of 1985, which amended subsection (a-1), but not the misspelled word "Commissioners".
