CHAPTER 827

(House Bill 1840)

AN ACT concerning

Health Facilities - Certificate of Need - Exemptions

FOR the purpose of adding an exemption from the certificate of need process for a capital expenditure for equipment, construction, or renovations that does not change the health services or bed capacity of a <u>certain</u> health facility; and generally relating to exemptions from the certificate of need process.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article - Health - General Section 19-115(k) Annotated Code of Maryland (1982 Volume and 1985 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Health - General

19-115.

- (k) (1) A certificate of need is required before any of the following capital expenditures are made by or on behalf of a health care facility:
- (i) Any expenditure that, under generally accepted accounting principles, is not properly chargeable as an operating or maintenance expense, if:
- 1. The expenditure is made as part of an acquisition, improvement, or expansion, and, after adjustment for inflation as provided in the regulations of the Commission, the total expenditure, including the cost of each study, survey, design, plan, working drawing, specification, and other essential activity, is more than \$600,000;
- 2. The expenditure is made as part of a replacement of any plant and equipment of the health care
