

(a) [(1)] If a court terminates the commitment of an individual who was committed under Part IV of this subtitle, the court shall refer the individual to the criminal court with jurisdiction over the individual, for resumption of the pending criminal proceeding.

[(2) If a court terminates the commitment of an individual who was committed under Part V of this subtitle, the court shall refer the individual to the correctional institution, for resumption of the sentence.]

(b) For the time that the individual spent in institutional custody between the date on which the commitment proceeding began and the commitment ended, the individual shall receive full credit towards any sentence.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be applied in all proceedings, including appeals, pending on the effective date of this Act and, except as expressly provided in Section 3 of this Act, all rights accruing under the statutes repealed by this Act shall be regarded as remedial in nature and are terminated on the effective date of this Act.

SECTION -2- 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act may not be construed to affect any commitment of any individual under Title 9, Subtitle 6, Part V of the Health - General Article made before July 1, 1986, and the provisions repealed or amended by this Act shall apply to an individual so committed as if the provisions had not been repealed or amended.

SECTION -3- 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1986.
