A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

The Republic of South Africa

FOR the purpose of urging the immediate ~~and unconditional~~ release of Nelson Mandela ~~and--all--other--South--African--political~~ prisoners ~~and--detainees.~~

WHEREAS, The Republic of South Africa is the only country in the world to base its governmental system on racism, openly refusing the most fundamental civil and political rights, including citizenship, to the black majority population; and

WHEREAS, The South African system, known as apartheid, has been condemned by the world community as illegitimate and a crime
