Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 191.

This bill provides that when the State pays the actuarially determined contribution for a teacher who is in a local retirement system, the State shall pay the amount required in the State system, or the amount required in the local system, whichever is less.

House Bill 378, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 13, 1986, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 191.
