(f) (3) (i) In Baltimore County, any organization which operates a carnival, bazaar, or raffle under this section shall first obtain [from the chief of police of Baltimore County] a permit which provides that such carnival, bazaar, or raffle shall be managed personally only by the members of the organization and the permit shall not be transferable.

(ii) Only those bona fide volunteer fire, religious, fraternal, civic, veterans, veterans' hospital, amateur athletic, or charitable organizations or corporations shall be eligible for a permit under this paragraph which spend the greater part of their funds for volunteer fire, religious, fraternal, civic, veterans, veterans' hospital, amateur athletic, or charitable purposes in Baltimore County.

[(iii) 1. Before the chief of police of Baltimore County shall issue a permit for any such carnival, bazaar, or raffle, it shall be the duty of the chief of police to ascertain the character of the organization on whose behalf the application is made to determine if such application comes within the provisions of this section.

2. The chief of police of Baltimore County shall make available permits under this paragraph on a long term basis for a period not to exceed 6 months.

3. The application and the action taken on it by the chief of police of Baltimore County shall be a public record.]

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1986.

Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 884.

This bill exempts property used solely for nonresidential purposes from certain provisions of the Maryland Condominium Act that concern the adoption of an annual budget, certain warranty provisions, the termination of certain leases and contracts by
