FOR the purpose of providing that, on conviction of a violation of certain prohibitions against abandonment of a vehicle, a court may order the defendant to make restitution to a governmental entity for certain expenses; altering a definition of the term "crime" to include a violation of certain prohibitions against abandonment of a vehicle for the purpose of authorizing a court order of certain restitution; and generally relating to restitution for a violation of certain prohibitions against abandonment of a vehicle.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments

640.

- (a) In this subtitle, the following words have the meanings indicated, unless the context of their use indicates otherwise.
- (1) "ABANDONED VEHICLE" HAS THE SAME MEANING AS STATED IN § 25-201 OF THE TRANSPORTATION ARTICLE.
- [(1)] (2) "Court" means the Court of Appeals, Court of Special Appeals, circuit court, and District Court of Maryland, or any of them, unless the context clearly requires a contrary meaning.
- [(2)] (3) "Crime" means an act committed by any person in the State of Maryland which would constitute a crime as defined in Article 27 of the Annotated Code of Maryland or at common law, OR A VIOLATION UNDER § 25-202 OF THE TRANSPORTATION ARTICLE. However, an act involving the operation of a motor vehicle which results in injury does not constitute a crime for the purpose of this article unless the injuries were intentionally inflicted through the use of a vehicle.
