Dear Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 816.

This bill requires the Secretary of Personnel to document in writing that reasonable accommodations were considered before denying a person State employment for medical reasons. The Secretary must also state the nature of the accommodations considered, and the reason for refusing the accommodations.

Senate Bill 239, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 27, 1986, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 816.
