In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 939.

This bill authorizes the County Commissioners of Cecil County to collect from "weekend prisoners" the cost to the county of food, lodging, and clothing.

Senate Bill 450, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 13, 1986, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 939.

AN ACT concerning

Cecil County - Collection of Prisoner Expenses
