

terms shall be staggered as established during the initial appointments;

9. A majority of the Council shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business. The Council may adopt any other procedures necessary to ensure the orderly transaction of business;
10. The members of the Council may not receive any compensation for their services. The public members may be reimbursed for their reasonable expenses incurred in the performance of duties, in accordance with the standard travel regulations, and as provided in the State budget;

B. The Council shall:

1. Submit an annual report to the Governor, the Cabinet Council, and the General Assembly;
2. Advise the Governor and the Cabinet Council on:
 - a. The development of a comprehensive State policy on food and nutrition and, as necessary, subsequent modifications or revisions of that policy; and
 - b. Promoting, developing, coordinating and conducting in cooperation with other federal, state, local or private agencies, unified programs for education, prevention and treatment of malnutrition and poor dietary habits.
3. Review existing and planned food and nutrition programs.

- C. The existence of the Council shall continue until termination by Executive Order.
