permeates all socioeconomic levels. Particularly, adolescent pregnancy problems have serious adverse health, social, educational, psychological, and economic consequences on adolescents and on the community at large. These serious adverse consequences and problems justify the need for a State initiative designed for the development and implementation of community-based comprehensive, multiservice programs which integrate and supplement existing health, education, and social services. This program will assist adolescents to avoid unwanted pregnancies and assist pregnant adolescents and adolescent parents to become productive, independent contributors to family and community life. The costs of providing the health, educational, social, and economic services are likely to reap substantial benefits to society; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- (A) THE COUNCIL CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING 18 MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR:
 - (1) THE SECRETARY OF HUMAN RESOURCES;
 - (2) THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE;
 - (3) THE SECRETARY OF EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING;
