(b) "Broker" means any person[,] who solicits, takes orders, sells or distributes nursery stock in the State other than a nurseryman or dealer.

(d) "Nursery stock" means (1) any hardy plant or plant that survives Maryland winters, including a deciduous or evergreen tree, shrub, or woody vine whether cultivated, native, or wild, and all viable parts of the plant; (2) any nonhardy plant or plant part to be distributed in another state that requires [plan] PLANT inspection and certification before entering that state; and (3) any other plant included by the Secretary, if regulating its movement is necessary to control any dangerously injurious plant pest.

Registration fees constitute a special fund to be used only to defray partially the cost of inspection, sampling, analysis, and other expenses necessary for administering this subtitle.
