- (ii) If there is no resident Senator, then with the consent of the members of the Frederick County delegation of the General Assembly.
- (2) To qualify for appointment as an alcoholic beverages inspector, a person:
 - (i) Shall be of high moral character;
- (ii) Shall possess a sound reputation for sobriety, honesty, and integrity; and
- (iii) Shall devote full time to the duties of the office.
 - (3) (i) The term of an inspector is 4 years.
- (ii) [The terms of the inspectors are staggered as required by the terms provided for inspectors of the board on July 1, 1985.
- (iii)] An inspector who is appointed after a term has begun serves only until a successor is appointed.
- (4) The Governor may remove an inspector with the advice and consent of:
 - (i) The Senate; or
- (ii) If there is no resident Senator, then with the consent of the members of the Frederick County delegation of the General Assembly.
 - (5) Grounds for removal are:
 - (i) Incompetence;
- (ii) Misconduct while performing the duties as
 an inspector;
 - (iii) Neglect of a duty required by law; or
- (iv) Unprofessional or dishonorable conduct in performing the duties as an inspector.
- (6) (i) [Each] AN inspector shall receive an annual salary of \$17,000, be reimbursed for reasonable expenses, and receive mileage at the standard rate set by the County Commissioners.
- (ii) Mileage does not include travel to and from the inspector's home and office.
