- (2) The implied warranty of merchantability; or
- (3) The implied warranty of fitness.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1986.

CHAPTER 260

(House Bill 1637)

AN ACT concerning

Physicians - Disciplinary Actions

FOR the purpose of prohibiting physicians from accepting or agreeing to accept certain payments for bringing or referring patients; and generally relating to grounds for disciplinary actions against physicians.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article - Health Occupations Section 14-504(16) Annotated Code of Maryland (1981 Volume and 1985 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Health Occupations

14-504.

Subject to the hearing provisions of § 14-505 of this subtitle, the Commission, on the affirmative vote of a majority of its full authorized membership, may reprimand any licensee, place any licensee on probation, or suspend or revoke a license if the licensee:

(16) Pays or agrees to pay any sum to any person for bringing or referring a patient OR ACCEPTS OR AGREES TO ACCEPT ANY SUM FROM ANY PERSON FOR BRINGING OR REFERRING A PATIENT;

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1986.
