- (i) The filing of the application; and
 - (ii) The findings of the investigation.
- (E) THE SECRETARY SHALL REPORT TO THE LEGISLATIVE POLICY COMMITTEE BY DECEMBER 1ST OF EACH YEAR CONCERNING EACH PRIVATE GROUP HOME AND-ALTERNATIVE-LIVING-UNIT PROPOSED DURING THE PRECEDING YEAR. THIS REPORT SHALL DISCUSS THE FOLLOWING:
- (1) WHETHER THE NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENT HAS FACILITATED THE ESTABLISHMENT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE HOME; AND
- (2) THE OVERALL SUCCESS OR FAILURE OF ESTABLISHING THE HOME IN THE COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY.

SECTION--2:--AND-BE-IT-FURTHER-ENACTED, That-this-Act--shall take-effect-July-1,-1987.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1987. It shall remain effective for a period of -3-4 years and, at the end of June 30, ± 990 1991, and with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
