- (2) To ameliorate conditions that breed delinquency, youth suicide, and family disruption; and
 - (3) To function as an advocate of youth needs.
- (b) (1) The [Administration] AGENCY shall adopt rules and regulations that set eligibility guidelines for State funding of youth services bureaus under this section.
- (2) The rules and regulations shall require that each State-aided youth services bureau provide, free of charge, at convenient hours:
 - (i) Individual, family, and group counseling;
 - (ii) Referral and information services;
- (iii) Crisis intervention, including intervention relating to youth suicide prevention;
 - (iv) Informal counseling; and
- (v) In accordance with particular community needs:
 - 1. Tutoring;
 - 2. Alternative leisure activities:
 - Employment assistance;
- 4. Community education, including training and information relating to youth suicide prevention; and
 - 5. Other specialized services.
 - (c) The [Administration] AGENCY shall:
- (1) As to each youth services bureau receiving State funding:
 - (i) Monitor its operations;
 - (ii) Evaluate annually its effectiveness; and
- (iii) Stop funding a youth services bureau that is ineffective or that, for 2 years, fails to meet the eligibility guidelines for State funding; and
- (2) Review and either approve or disapprove the application for State funding of a youth services bureau or proposed youth services bureau.
