

(ii) Actions against a foster parent by a natural parent for any accident to the foster child.

(c) (1) Subject to the provisions of this section, the [Secretary] DIRECTOR shall reimburse a foster parent for costs of bodily injury or property damage that the foster child causes to the foster parent and that insurance does not cover.

(2) Before reimbursement under this subsection, the [Secretary] DIRECTOR shall be satisfied that the actions of the foster parent did not contribute substantially to the bodily injury or property damage sustained.

(3) Reimbursement under this subsection shall be made for all costs to a maximum amount of \$5,000. However, all payments in excess of \$500 require the approval of the Board of Public Works.
