- (d) An applicant who begins employment as an environmental sanitarian on or after July 1, 1985 shall be licensed by the Board if the applicant:
- (1) Qualifies for the examination required under Section [5.5-304] 11-304 of this subtitle; and
- (2) Takes and attains a passing score on the examination.
- (e) The Board may waive any examination requirement under this section if the Board considers the applicant to be recognized as outstanding in the field of environmental health.

[5.5-304] 11-304.

- (a) An applicant who otherwise qualifies for licensure is entitled to be examined as provided in this section.
- (b) An applicant qualifies to take the examination if the applicant:
- (1) Was employed as an environmental sanitarian on or before June 30, 1985 and has obtained at least 6 months of experience in environmental health acceptable to the Board; or
- (2) (i) Has graduated from an accredited college or university with a baccalaureate degree in environmental science or environmental health; and
- (ii) Has obtained 12 months of experience in the field of environmental health acceptable to the Board; or
- (3) (i) Has graduated from an accredited college or university with a baccalaureate degree in the physical, biological, or environmental sciences including:
- l. A minimum of 60 semester credit hours or the equivalent quarter credit hours of physical, biological, and environmental sciences acceptable to the Board which includes at least 1 laboratory course in 2 of the following fields: chemistry, physics, and biology; and

## 2. A course in mathematics; and

- (ii) Has obtained 12 months of experience in the field of environmental health acceptable to the Board; or
- (4) (i) Has graduated from an accredited college or university with a baccalaureate degree that includes:
- 1. 30 semester credit hours or the equivalent in quarter units in the physical, biological, and
