11-603.

(a) It is unlawful within the State of Maryland knowingly to sell, install, consent or cause to be installed glazing materials other than safety glazing materials in, or for use in, any hazardous location.

(b) No liability under this [subheading] SUBTITLE is created as to workmen who are employees of a contractor, subcontractor, or other employer responsible for compliance with this [subheading] SUBTITLE.

11-604.

Whoever violates the provisions of this [subheading] SUBTITLE is guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$1,000, or to undergo imprisonment of not more than one year, or both.

11-605.

This [subheading] SUBTITLE supersedes any local, municipal or county ordinance or parts thereof relating to the subject matter hereof, except that requirements and regulations more stringent than those in effect under this [subheading] SUBTITLE may be adopted and enforced by the political subdivisions of this State.
