SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

12B.

(a) A Class A light wine license may be issued by the clerk of the circuit court of the county in which the place of business is located to any holder of a Class 4 manufacturer's license. In Baltimore, Frederick, [and] Harford, AND WASHINGTON counties a Class A light wine license may also be issued to a holder of a Class 3 manufacturer's license, who makes wine from agricultural products grown in Maryland. Baltimore County wineries applying for such a license are exempt from quotas established by the
