shall bear interest at such rate or rates as the Commission determines to be advantageous to the Sanitary District and otherwise in the public interest. The interest on the notes shall be payable at such time or times on or before the maturity of the notes as the Commission shall determine. The notes is shall be in such form and shall be executed in such manner as the Commission shall provide. The notes shall be payable from the proceeds of the bonds in anticipation of which they are issued; provided, however, that the Commission, in its discretion, in lieu of retiring the notes by means of bonds, may retire the notes from any funds available for the payment of bonds authorized by this Act for the project or projects for which the notes were issued, in which event the maximum amount of bonds which may be issued under the provisions of this Act shall be reduced by the amount of the notes so retired.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Commission may provide in any resolution authorizing issuance of the bonds that the proceeds of the sale of the bonds or notes may be used to pay either the first installment, or both the first and second installments, of interest accruing on the bonds, pending the levy and collection of the taxes as provided by this Act for the payment of principal and interest.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1987.

FOR the purpose of permitting the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission (WSSC) to impose certain civil penalties and fines for violations of the Erosion and Sediment Control Regulations and the Plumbing, Gasfitting, and Sewer Cleaning Regulations of the WSSC; repealing certain provisions relating to the imposition of fines for violation of provisions requiring written permits in Montgomery and Prince George's counties; permitting the WSSC to adopt certain regulations; specifying that violations of certain regulations are civil offenses and not criminal
