- (d) "Amortizable basis" means the portion of the basis attributable to amounts expended for certified rehabilitation.
- [Every person is entitled to deduction with respect] THE HISTORIC STRUCTURE PRESERVATION EXPENSE SHALL BE EQUAL to the amortizable basis of any certified amortization of the nondepreciable historic structure based on a period of 60 months. This amortization [deduction] EXPENSE shall be an amount, with respect to each month of the period within the taxable year, equal to the amortizable basis at the end of such month divided by the number of months (including the month for which the [deduction] AMORTIZATION is completed) remaining in the period. amortizable basis at the end of the month shall be computed without regard to the amortization [deduction] for the month. The 60-month period shall begin, as to any historic structure, at the election of the taxpayer, with the month following the month in which the basis is acquired, or with the succeeding taxable year.
- (f) The election of the taxpayer to take the amortization [deduction] EXPENSE and to begin the 60-month period with the month following the month in which the basis is acquired, or with the taxable year succeeding the taxable year in which the basis is acquired, shall be made by filing a statement of the election with the State Comptroller or his delegate, in a manner and within a time period as the State Comptroller or his delegate may prescribe by regulation.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1987 and shall be applicable for all taxable years after December 31, 1986.
