

The grammatical error is a publishing error, which occurred in the printing of the 1986 Supplement to the 1983 Replacement Volume for Volume 6 of the Annotated Code.

The grammatical error was noted by the Computer Division of the Department of Legislative Reference.

Article 78 - Public Service Commission Law

50J.

(e) Taxicabs which are being operated in Baltimore City may transport passengers from the city into Baltimore County and may return for the same passengers. No passengers shall be solicited by the said taxicabs within the county at any time. Nothing in this subheading shall serve to impede the operation of taxicabs between Baltimore City and [Friendship] BALTIMORE-WASHINGTON International Airport in the manner heretofore permitted by law.

DRAFTER'S NOTE: This corrects an outdated reference in Article 78, § 50J(e).

Friendship International Airport was renamed Baltimore-Washington International Airport in 1973, following the purchase of the airport by the State from Baltimore City, pursuant to Ch. 180 of the Acts of 1972.

The outdated reference was noted by the Computer Division of the Department of Legislative Reference.

Article 78A - Public Works

14B.

(a) The Board of Public Works, acting pursuant to a formal request by the Maryland Historical Trust, may acquire part or all of any property and premises which in the judgment of the Maryland Historical Trust is an historic landmark worthy of public care and preservation, by purchase or [gift under the procedures in Title 12 of the Real Property Article of the Code] GIFT, with any funds available for this purpose from time to time.

DRAFTER'S NOTE: This corrects an error in a cross-reference in Article 78A, § 14B(a).

Title 12 of the Real Property Article relates to eminent domain and condemnation rather than to gifts of land.
