Article 100 - Work, Labor and Employment

(c) The provisions of this section shall not apply to the law-enforcement personnel of the Maryland Alcohol AND TOBACCO Tax Enforcement Unit.

(1) An agency may adopt alternate work schedules as permitted by the Fair Labor Standards Act for the purpose of determining overtime compensation for its law-enforcement employees or fire fighters.

(2) A law-enforcement employee of the Maryland State Police or Natural Resources Police who is called out to duty on a regularly scheduled off-duty day or during a regularly scheduled on-duty day after going off duty shall be compensated at one and one-half times the employee's regular hourly rate. This payment shall be made for not less than four hours time on any day the employee is called out. A law-enforcement employee of any other State agency who is called out to duty on a regularly scheduled off-duty day shall be compensated at one and one-half times the employee's regular hourly rate for the time worked.
