9-268. CIVIL PENALTIES -- IN GENERAL.

(A) "PERSON" DEFINED.

IN THIS SECTION, "PERSON" INCLUDES A WATER, SEWERAGE, OR SANITARY DISTRICT.

(A) (B) IN GENERAL.

A PERSON IS LIABLE TO THE STATE FOR CIVIL PENALTIES IF THE PERSON:

- (1) FAILS TO COMPLY WITH A FINAL ORDER OF THE SECRETARY WITHIN THE TIME STATED-IN SET FOR COMPLIANCE WITH THE ORDER: OR
- (2) AFTER AN APPEAL HAS BEEN FILED UNDER-\$-9-263-0F THIS-SUBTITUE, FAILS TO OBEY OR IN GOOD FAITH BEGIN TO OBEY A FINAL ORDER OF THE SECRETARY WITHIN 10 DAYS AFTER THE COURT ENTERS A FINAL JUDGMENT AFFIRMING THE ORDER.
 - (B) (C) AMOUNT OF CIVIL PENALTIES.

THESE CIVIL PENALTIES ARE:

- (1) A BASIC PENALTY NOT LESS THAN \$500 NOR MORE THAN \$10,000; AND
- (2) AN ADDITIONAL PENALTY NOT LESS THAN \$500 NOR MORE THAN \$10,000 A DAY FOR EACH DAY OF NONCOMPLIANCE AFTER THE TIME STATED-IN-THE-SECRETARY'S-ORDER FOR COMPLIANCE WITH THE ORDER, UP TO A MAXIMUM OF \$50,000.
 - (e) (D) CIVIL ACTION.

THE-DEPARTMENT-SHALL-FILE-A-CIVIL-ACTION-IF-IT-WISHES-TO RECOVER THE CIVIL PENALTIES UNDER THIS SECTION IN A CIVIL ACTION.
