Section 5-905 Annotated Code of Maryland (1984 Volume and 1986 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Family Law

5-905.

- (a) (1) Promptly after receiving a report of suspected abuse, the local department or the appropriate law enforcement agency, as appropriate, or both, if jointly agreed on, shall make a thorough investigation to protect the welfare of the child or children.
- (2) Within 24 hours after receiving the report of suspected abuse, the local department or the appropriate law enforcement agency shall:
 - (i) see the child;
- (ii) attempt to have an on-site interview with the child's caretaker; and
- (iii) decide on the safety of the child, wherever the child is, and of other children in the home.
 - (b) The investigation shall include:
- (1) a determination of the nature, extent, and cause of the abuse, if any; and
 - (2) if the suspected abuse is verified:
- (i) a determination of the identity of the person or persons responsible for the abuse;
- (ii) a determination of the name, age, and condition of any other child in the same household;
- (iii) an evaluation of the parents and the home environment; and
- (iv) a determination of any other pertinent facts or matters.
- (c) On request by the local department, the local State's Attorney shall assist in the investigation.
