Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 727.

Senate Bill 727 requires that, when a petition of guardianship of a child is filed, the attorney for the child's parents must also be given notice in a case where the child has been adjudicated to be a child in need of assistance, or neglected, or abused.

House Bill 590, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 14, 1987, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 727.
