House Bill No. 499

AN ACT concerning

Vehicle Laws - Transporting-and Leaving Animals Cats and Dogs in Motor Vehicles --Prohibitions

FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from leaving an-animal a cat or dog unattended in a standing or parked motor vehicle under certain circumstances; authorizing certain individuals to use reasonable force to remove an-animal a cat or dog from a vehicle under certain circumstances; providing that certain individuals may not be held liable for damages directly resulting from certain authorized actions; prohibiting-a-person-from-transporting-an-animal-in-a-motor vehicle--except--under--certain-circumstances; and generally relating to transporting-and leaving animals cats and dogs in motor vehicles.

BY adding to
