(pp) (3) (ii) The effective date of any plan established by the Board of County Commissioners shall conform to the provisions of Article 73B, [§§ 28 and 138] § 168 of the Code that concern the withdrawal by a county, municipal corporation, or other political subdivision of the State from the Employees' Retirement System of the State and the Pension System for Employees of the State and the transfer to a local retirement or pension system.

Article 26A - Criminal Injuries Compensation Act

5.

(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, the following persons shall be eligible for awards pursuant to this article:

(8) Any person who paid or assumed responsibility for the funeral expenses of a victim who died as a result of a crime or an eligible person who is killed as a direct result under [subsection (a)(4) and (7) of this section] PARAGRAPHS (4) AND (7) OF THIS SUBSECTION.
