- (a) If a person is found guilty of murder, the court or jury that determined the person's guilt shall state in the verdict whether the person is guilty of murder in the first degree or murder in the second degree.
- (b) A person found guilty of murder in the first degree shall be sentenced either to death or to imprisonment for life. The sentence shall be imprisonment for life unless (1) the State notified the person in writing at least 30 days prior to trial that it intended to seek a sentence of death, and advised the person of each aggrevating circumstance upon which it intended to rely, and (2) a sentence of death is imposed in accordance with § 413.
- (c) A person found guilty of murder in the second degree shall be sentenced to imprisonment for not more than 30 years.
