(3) TO THE EXTENT PROVIDED BY FEDERAL LAW, THE ADMINISTRATION MAY USE A DRIVER'S SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER AS AN IDENTIFYING NUMBER FOR A DRIVER'S LICENSE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1987.

CHAPTER 173

(Senate Bill 653)

AN ACT concerning

Crimes - Expungement of Records

FOR-the-purpose-of-altering-the-time-period-in-which-a-person-may petition---to---expunge--a-criminal--record--under--certain circumstances;-and-generally-relating-to-the-expungement--of a-criminal-record-for-certain-first-time-offenders.

FOR the purpose of providing a certain procedure for the expungement of public criminal records that relate to violations of certain laws relating to controlled dangerous substances; and generally relating to providing a certain procedure for expungement of certain public criminal records.
