(f) On receipt of the guardian's report under subsection (b) of this section, and every 12 months thereafter, the court:

(b) (2) (i) A child may not be committed to the custody or guardianship of a local department and placed in foster care solely because the child's parent or guardian lacks shelter.

(ii) The [Administration] LOCAL DEPARTMENT shall make appropriate referrals to emergency shelter services and other services for the homeless family with a child which lacks shelter.
