dispose of or cause to be disposed of any used oil by discharge, dump, or deposit into sewers, drainage systems, surface or ground waters, any waters in this State, or by incineration or as refuse, or onto any public or private land unless such land is designated by the State or by any of its agencies or political subdivisions as a collection facility for such disposal, dumping, or deposit and the used oil is placed in a receptacle or container installed or located on such property.
