- (c) (1) Any employer who violates any provision of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, on conviction, is subject to a fine not less than \$250 nor more than \$500 for each offense. If an employer compels a nonmanagerial or nonprofessional employee to work on his or her chosen day of rest in violation of the provisions of this section, that employer is liable to the aggrieved employee for wages at the rate of 3 times the employee's regular rate of pay for all hours worked by that employee on his or her chosen day of rest.
- (2) This section does not permit any fine or penalty against any supervisory employee or agent who has been caused, directed, or authorized by his employer to violate any provision of this section, in which case the employer shall be subject to the sanctions prescribed by this section.
- (d) (1) Except in Montgomery County and Prince George's County, a new or used car dealer may not sell, dispose, barter, deal in, deliver, give away, show or offer for sale any motor vehicle or any certificate of title for any motor vehicle on Sunday.
- (2) Any dealer who violates any provision of this subsection is guilty of a misdemeanor and, on conviction, is subject to a fine not exceeding \$10,000.
- (e) The provisions of this section do not apply to the laws pertaining to alcoholic beverages sales on Sunday or to the service of process on Sunday.
- (f) The provisions of this section do not apply in Wicomico[, Washington,] and Allegany Counties.

- In Wicomico[, Washington,] and Allegany Counties, no contracts hereafter entered into and executed by and between the parties thereto on Sunday shall be subject to the prohibitions and penalties elsewhere contained in this subheading.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section(s) 534-O of Article 27 Crimes and Punishments of the Annotated Code of Maryland be repealed.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
