- A PROCUREMENT OFFICER MAY REQUIRE A CONTRACTOR TO PROVIDE A PERFORMANCE BOND OR OTHER SECURITY ON A PROCUREMENT CONTRACT FOR SUPPLIES, SERVICES, OR CONSTRUCTION RELATED SERVICES IF:
  - (1) CIRCUMSTANCES WARRANT SECURITY: AND
- (2) THE PRICE OF THE PROCUREMENT CONTRACT EXCEEDS \$50,000.
  - REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former SF § 11-121(a)(2), (c), and (d).

In subsection (b) of this section, the former reference to a "bond" is deleted as included in the broad reference to "security".

- 13-217. MULTI-YEAR PROCUREMENT CONTRACTS.
  - (A) "MULTI-YEAR CONTRACT" DEFINED.

IN THIS SECTION, "MULTI-YEAR CONTRACT" MEANS A PROCUREMENT CONTRACT THAT REQUIRES APPROPRIATIONS FOR MORE THAN 1 FISCAL YEAR.

- (B) ALLOWED.
- (1) A UNIT MAY ENTER INTO A MULTI-YEAR CONTRACT SUBJECT TO:
  - (I) STANDARDS ESTABLISHED BY THE BOARD; AND
- (II) REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE PRIMARY PROCUREMENT UNIT THAT IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE TYPE OF PROCUREMENT INVOLVED.
- (2) A MULTI-YEAR CONTRACT SHALL BE SUBJECT TO REVIEW AND APPROVAL BY THAT PRIMARY PROCUREMENT UNIT.
  - (C) CONDITIONS FOR APPROVAL.
