## Preamble

A preventive maintenance program is required to ensure that all vehicles are properly maintained in a safe operating condition when traveling on the highways in this State. It is the intent of the General Assembly to require a certain minimum level of maintenance for vehicles to reduce and prevent traffic accidents and to promote highway safety; now, therefore,
