## LAWS OF MARYLAND

- [(g)] (F) "Job description" means a document executed by a physician assistant and physician that has been approved under this title to permit the delegation of medical acts to a certified physician assistant.
- [(h)] (G) "National certifying examination" means an examination offered by a national organization, which certifies physician assistants as having achieved a certain level of training.
- [(i)] (H) "Physician assistant" means an individual who is certified under this title to perform delegated medical acts under the supervision of a physician.
- [(j)] (I) "Practice as a physician assistant" means the performance of medical acts delegated to a physician assistant under this title.
- [(k)] (J) "Supervising physician" means a physician who has been approved by the Board to supervise 1 or more physician assistants.
- [(1)] (K) "Supervision" means the responsibility of a physician to exercise on site supervision or immediately available direction for physician assistants performing delegated medical acts.

(b) (l) In addition to the duties set forth elsewhere in this title, the Board [or Commission] shall adopt regulations to carry out the provisions of this title.

## (2) The Board shall:

- (i) Consider all recommendations of the Committee; and
- (ii) Provide a written explanation of the Board's reasons for rejecting or modifying the Committee's recommendations.

## (3) The Board may:

- (i) Investigate any alleged unauthorized practice of a physician assistant; AND
- (ii) Investigate any conduct that may be cause
  for disciplinary action under this title[; and
  - (iii) Report its findings to the Commission].
