(Senate Bill 524)

AN ACT concerning

Jurisdiction - District Court and Circuit Court

FOR the purpose of clarifying specifying that a circuit court, and not the District Court, has jurisdiction of certain offenses if the circuit court has jurisdiction of another offense arising from the same circumstances; and generally relating to the jurisdictions of the District Court and the circuit courts over certain offenses.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
