Chapter 703 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1986 Section  $4\,$ 

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Health Occupations

## 4.5-302.

- (a) To qualify for a license, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the requirements of this section.
  - (b) The applicant must be of good moral character.
  - (c) The applicant must be at least 18 years old.
  - (d) The applicant for licensure as a dietitian shall:
- (1) (i) Have satisfactorily completed academic requirements for the field of dietetics as approved by the Board;
- (ii) Have received a baccalaureate degree or a higher degree from a college or university approved by the Board; and
- (iii) Have satisfactorily completed a program of supervised clinical experience approved by the Commission on Dietetic Registration of the American Dietetic Association, or a comparable experience approved by the Board; or
- (2) Submit to the Board proof of registration through the Commission on Dietetic Registration of the American Dietetic Association.
- (e) The applicant for licensure as a licensed nutritionist shall:
- (1) Meet the requirements of subsection (d) of this section; or
- (2) (i) Have received a master's or doctoral degree from a college or university accredited by a regional accrediting body recognized by the Council on Post-Secondary Accreditation in
