

(i) Is attending an eligible institution and has completed at least 1 year in good academic standing at the institution;

(ii) Graduated from high school at least 5 years before application for a senatorial scholarship; or

(iii) Is accepted for admission to a private ~~postsecondary~~ ~~proprietary~~ CAREER institution, if the institution's curriculum is approved by the [State Board for Higher Education] COMMISSION, and the institution is accredited by a national accrediting association approved by the United States Department of Education; OR

(IV) IS PLANNING TO ATTEND OR IS ATTENDING A MARYLAND COMMUNITY COLLEGE.

(b) Each applicant shall:

(1) Be a resident of this State; and

(2) At the time of his initial application, be a resident of the legislative district from which he seeks an appointment.

(c) (1) Each applicant shall demonstrate to the State ~~Scholarship-[Board]~~ ADMINISTRATION COMMISSION ADMINISTRATION a definite financial need, and each Senator shall consider the financial need of each applicant.

(2) Each Senator is the final judge of the financial need of each applicant to whom he awards a scholarship, and the ~~State---Scholarship---[Board]~~ ADMINISTRATION COMMISSION ADMINISTRATION may not negate this judgment or impose requirements of time or procedure.

(d) Each applicant shall accept any other conditions attached to the award.

(a) Each Senator may award \$19,500 IN FISCAL 1989, \$24,500 IN FISCAL 1990, \$29,500 IN FISCAL 1991, AND IN FISCAL 1992 AND EACH YEAR THEREAFTER ~~\$14,500~~ \$34,500 of senatorial scholarships each year.

(b) (1) The annual allocation under subsection (a) of this section applies to initial-year awards. After 4 years of operation, the annual allocation to each Senator for initial-year and continuing awards may not exceed four times the amount of his allocation under subsection (a) of this section.
