- (i) Tuition and mandatory fees;
- (ii) Room and board; and
- (iii) Books.
- (d) Each recipient of a scholarship under this section shall give a bond to the county, with security satisfactory to it, that after graduation he will practice his profession in the county for at least:
- (1) 5 years if the scholarship is for medicine or dentistry; or
 - (2) 3 years if the scholarship is for nursing.

- (a) In this section, "School of Medicine" means the School of Medicine of the University of Maryland SYSTEM.
- (c) Each recipient of a medical scholarship awarded under this section shall:
- (1) Have been a resident of this State for at least 5 years before the award;
- (2) Have been approved for admission to the School of Medicine;
- (3) Have financial needs and resources that meet the requirements of the State--Scholarship--{Board}-ADMINISTRATION COMMISSION ADMINISTRATION to assure that he has a definite financial need; and
- (4) Furnish a surety bond to the State conditioned that:
- (i) Following graduation from medical school, the recipient will enter a family practice residency program; and
- (ii) Immediately following completion of the residency program, the recipient will for at least 3 years engage in the family practice of medicine in an area determined by the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene, in consultation with the Medical and Chirurgical Faculty of Maryland, to have an acute need for physicians in family practice.
 - (d) (1) Each year 2 medical scholarships shall be awarded.
