- (2) Each medical scholarship:
 - (i) Is in the amount of \$7,500 a year;
- (ii) May be used for tuition, fees, and other costs at the School of Medicine;
- (iii) Shall be paid by the State--Scholarship {Board}--ADMINISTRATION COMMISSION ADMINISTRATION directly to the School of Medicine: and
- (iv) May be held as long as the recipient is making satisfactory progress towards the degree of doctor of medicine, but not longer than 4 years.
- State---Scholarship----{Board} (e) (l) Each year, the ADMINISTRATION COMMISSION ADMINISTRATION shall announce the availability and conditions of these medical scholarships at colleges and universities both in and outside of this State.
- (2) Each applicant shall submit an application by the State--Scholarship--{Board}--ADMINISTRATION provided COMMISSION ADMINISTRATION which demonstrates his merit eligibility.
- (3) The State--Scholarship--{Board}--ADMINISTRATION COMMISSION ADMINISTRATION shall award the scholarships recipients. If a recipient does not accept the scholarship, the Board shall reaward it.
- (f) The bond of each recipient of a medical scholarship this section shall be in an amount equal to the amount of the medical scholarship plus a reasonable rate of interest and other security satisfactory to the State-Scholarship-{Board} ADMINISTRATION COMMISSION ADMINISTRATION.

- (a) (1) In this section, the following words have the meanings indicated.
 - (2) "Medical education center" means an institution:
- (i) Whose objectives include the education of medical and allied health personnel; and
- (ii) That has residency programs or full departments in at least three primary care areas.
- (3) "Nurse practitioner" means a nurse practitioner as defined by the rules and regulations of the State Board of Nursing.
