

Chapter 159 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1986
Section 2

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 88B - State Police

19.

(c) Notwithstanding any other provisions of law the Superintendent may appoint, without examination, any police employee holding a commissioned rank to the rank of major and any police employee holding a commissioned rank of not less than captain to the rank of lieutenant colonel. A police employee appointed in accordance with this provision shall continue to serve at the Superintendent's pleasure. Upon termination of an appointment by the Superintendent under this subsection, the police employee may return to the rank held prior to the appointment or to a higher rank to which he has become eligible for promotion during his appointment, notwithstanding any other provision of law.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1986. [It shall remain effective for a period of two years, and at the end of May 31, 1988, and with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.]
