- The court costs in a traffic case including parking and impounding cases in which costs are imposed, are [\$5.00] \$10.00. SUCH COSTS SHALL ALSO BE APPLICABLE TO THOSE CASES IN WHICH THE DEFENDANT ELECTS TO WAIVE HIS RIGHT TO TRIAL AND PAY THE FINE OR PENALTY DEPOSIT ESTABLISHED BY THE CHIEF JUDGE OF THE DISTRICT COURT BY ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATION. In an uncontested parking impounding case in which the fines are paid directly to a political subdivisions or muncipality, costs are \$2.00, which costs shall be paid to and retained by the political subdivision or municipality. In an uncontested case in which the fine is paid directly to an agency of State government authorized by law to regulate parking of motor vehicles, the costs are \$2.00. and the costs shall be paid to the agency, which shall for receive and account these funds as in all other involving sums due the State through a State agency.
