THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS SHALL APPOINT A COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS ARTICLE.

1-41.

- (A) ON OR AFTER JANUARY 1, 1991 1990, THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR SHALL RECEIVE A 4-YEAR 1-YEAR CONTRACT, WHICH SHALL RUN IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE TERMS OF OFFICE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.
- (B) (1) THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR SHALL RECEIVE A SALARY AS ESTABLISHED IN THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR'S CONTRACT, BUT NOT LESS THAN \$30,000 PER YEAR.
- (2) THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR SHALL DEVOTE FULL-TIME TO THE POSITION.
- (3) THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR SHALL RECEIVE BENEFITS PROVIDED TO OTHER COUNTY EMPLOYEES.
- (C) IF AN INDIVIDUAL SELECTED FOR THE POSITION OF COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR IS NOT A RESIDENT OF CECIL COUNTY, THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR SHALL BECOME A COUNTY RESIDENT WITHIN 4 MONTHS AFTER APPOINTMENT.

1-42.

- (A) A COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR SHALL BE SELECTED ON THE BASIS OF MERIT, EDUCATION, AND APPROPRIATE EXPERIENCE.
 - (B) A COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR SHALL HAVE:
- (1) A MASTER'S--BEGREE BACHELOR'S DEGREE IN PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION OR AN EQUIVALENT DEGREE FROM AN ACCREDITED COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY; AND
- (2) A MINIMUM OF 5 3 YEARS' EXPERIENCE IN PUBLIC SECTOR ADMINISTRATION.

1-43.

THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR SHALL:

- (1) SUPERVISE AND IMPLEMENT THE POLICIES AND INSTRUCTIONS OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AS THE BOARD DIRECTS:
- (2) SERVE AS LIAISON OFFICER BETWEEN COUNTY DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES AND THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS; AND
- (3) HAVE ADDITIONAL POWERS AND DUTIES AS PRESCRIBED BY THE BOARD.
