- (a) As to all valuable paintings or other objects of decorative art located in a public area of any State building in the Annapolis area, except in a State room of [Government House] THE GOVERNOR'S MANSION, the Commission shall:
 - (1) keep a continuing inventory of the objects; and
- (2) be responsible for and supervise the acquisition, custody, display, location, preservation, proper care, security, and restoration of the objects.
- (b) (1) Each person or agency that desires to acquire a painting or object of decorative art for display in or on the premises of any State building in the Annapolis area, except in a room of [Government House] THE GOVERNOR'S MANSION, must receive both prior approval and final acceptance from the Commission.
