CHAPTER 634

(House Bill 95)

AN ACT concerning

Theft from Leased Oyster Bottoms - Penalties

FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Natural Resources to cause request the local State's Attorney's office to bring a criminal action for theft against a person catching, destroying, or transferring oysters on an oyster bottom leased by another person; requiring authorizing the Department to revoke suspend certain licenses of a person convicted of theft of oysters from a leased oyster bottom; and-providing-a-mandatory-minimum-and-discretionary--maximum time--before--which--the-Department-of-Natural-Resources-may reissue--certain--licenses; requiring the Department to provide certain notice and hearing requirements before suspending certain licenses; and generally relating to penalties for catching, destroying, or transferring oysters on oyster bottoms leased by another person.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article - Natural Resources Section 4-1118 and 4-1201 Annotated Code of Maryland (1983 Replacement Volume and 1987 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Natural Resources

4-1118.

- (a) (1) A person, other than the lessee, may not willfully and without authority catch oysters on any leased oyster bottom, or willfully destroy or transfer oysters on this land in any manner.
- (2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL CAUSE REQUEST THE OFFICE OF THE LOCAL STATE'S ATTORNEY TO BRING A CRIMINAL ACTION UNDER ARTICLE 27, § 342 OF THE CODE AGAINST A PERSON FOUND TO BE IN VIOLATION OF THIS SUBSECTION.
