WHEREAS, The State of Maryland is dedicated to maintaining a high quality of life for its residents; and

WHEREAS, Many counties in the State are experiencing substantial growth in population, employment, and economic development; and

WHEREAS, -- Transportation -- services -- should -- be -- improved -- to provide -- the -- public -- with -- efficient -- transportation -- connecting locations -- within -- the -- State; -- and

WHEREAS,-The-Maryland-Department-of-Transportation,-together with--local--governments,--is--responsible--for---operating---and improving--transit--systems--and--coordinating--transit--services statewide,-and

WHEREAS, The Department of Natural Resources is responsible for the acquisition of open spaces and areas for recreational uses; and

WHEREAS, The State should study whether the many existing railroad rights-of-way may be developed for use as--light--rail transportation--lines-and as bicycle-and-hiking multirecreational use trails; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:

- (a) The Maryland Department of Transportation and—the Department—of-Natural-Resources shall conduct—a-study—to identify existing rail rights—of-way within the State, and to provide the information to the Department of Natural Resources. The Department of Natural Resources shall determine what measures would be necessary for the State to acquire rights—of-way which are not needed for transportation purposes, for future transportation—and recreation needs.
- (b)--The--Department--of-Transportation-and-its-Mass-Transit Administration-shall-study-the-possible-development-of-light-rail transportation-within-existing-railroad-rights-of-way--throughout the-State:
- (c)  $\underline{(b)}$  The Department-of-Transportation-and-the Department of Natural Resources shall study the possible development of a statewide network of bicycle--and--hiking multirecreational use trails utilizing existing railroad rights-of-way.
- (d) (c) The Department-of-Transportation-and-the Department of Natural Resources shall report to the General Assembly on the results of the studies required by this Act on or before December 1, 1986 1989.
